As soon as you have received an acceptance letter from the partner university, send it immediately to the International Office. Then we can send you the necessary documents to apply for Erasmus+ funding.

Erasmus+ funding is only eligible for partner universities of SRH Berlin University of Applied Sciences. Below you will find an overview of the countries in which we can fund you via Erasmus+ if we have concluded a cooperation agreement with a partner university in the respective country for student exchanges via the Erasmus+ programme.

### ➤ Project year 2023

The funding rates apply from the winter semester 2023/24 till summer semester 2025.

### Possible increase in monthly funding rates (programme countries):

Students who go abroad with a child, who have a chronic disease or a degree of disability of 20% or more, who work besides studying or are first time academics in their family (participants with fewer opportunities) are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate of about 250,00€. For more information contact the international office.

In addition, we can grant you a one-time travel allowance of 50,00 € if you travel without a plane and not alone in a car (sustainable travel). Sustainable means of transport are bus, train, and carsharing. In addition, we will grant you up to four additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will provide you.

Students who go abroad with a child, who have a chronicle disease or a degree of disability of 20% or more, who work besides studying or are first time academics in their family (students from a non-academic home) are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate of about 250,00€.

Students who go abroad with a child, who have a chronic disease or a degree of disability of 20% or more, who work beside studying or are first academics (participants with fewer opportunities) are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate about 250,00€ and to receive a certain amount for their travel. In addition, we will grant you up to 6 additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will provide you.

### **Funding rates for blended short term mobilities (independent of the country)**

If you take part in a blended short term mobility, i.e. in a course/seminar/workshop organized with a partner institution and consisting of a virtual part and a possible short visit to the partner institution, you have the possibility to receive financial support for the short stay abroad (between 5 and 30 days).

### **Possible increase of funding rates (blended mobilities):**

In addition to the daily rate, you´ll receive also a travel lump sum depending on the distance of your destination.

In addition, we will grant you up to 6 additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. Sustainable means of transport are: Bus, train, carpool.

For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will provide you.

One day of travel before the activity and one day of travel after the activity can be covered by the individual support (regardless of sustainable travel).

### **Real costs application for participants with a degree of disability of 20 or more**

Participants with an assessed GdB of 20 or more have the possibility to apply for a grant for the real additional costs of the mobility abroad up to 15,000 € per semester within the framework of a long-term application.
