As soon as you have received an acceptance letter from the partner university, send it immediately to the International Office. Then we can send you the necessary documents to apply for Erasmus+ funding.

Erasmus+ funding is only eligible for partner universities of SRH Berlin University of Applied Sciences. Below you will find an overview of the countries in which we can fund you via Erasmus+ if we have concluded a cooperation agreement with a partner university in the respective country for student exchanges via the Erasmus+ programme.

Please note that these are not all the countries listed. The funding rates apply from the winter semester 2023/24.

## <u>Possible increase in monthly funding rates (programme countries):</u>

Students who go abroad with a child, who have a chronicle disease or a degree of disability of 20% or more, who work beside studying or are first academics (participants with fewer opportunities) are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate about 250,00€.

In addition, we can grant you a one-time travel allowance of 50,00 € if you travel without a plane and not alone in a car (sustainable travel). Sustainable means of transport are: Bus, train, carsharing. In addition, we will grant you up to four additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will provide you.

### Possible increase in monthly funding rates (programme countries):

Students who go abroad with a child, who have a chronicle disease or a degree of disability of 20% or more, who work beside studying or are first academics (participants with fewer opportunities) are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate about 250,00€ and to receive a certain amount for their travel. In addition, we can grant you a one-time travel allowance of 50,00 € if you travel without a plane and not alone in a car (sustainable travel). Sustainable means of transport are: Bus, train, carsharing. In addition, we will grant you up to four additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will provide you.

### Funding rates for blended short term mobilities (independent of the country)

If you take part in a blended mobility, i.e. in a course/seminar/workshop organised jointly with a partner university and consisting of a virtual part and a possible short visit to the partner university, you have the possibility to receive financial support for the short stay abroad (between 5 and 30 days).

## Possible increase of funding rates (blended mobilities):

We can grant you a one-off travel allowance of 50,00€ if you travel without a plane and not alone in a car (sustainable travel). Sustainable means of transport are: Bus, train, carpool. In addition, we will grant you up to four additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill in the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will send you.

One day of travel before the activity and one day of travel after the activity can be covered by the individual support (regardless of sustainable travel).



Students who go abroad with a child or have a degree of disability of 20% or more (participants with fewer opportunities) receive travel allowances for short-term mobility (see travel costs for outward and return journey) and one-off payments depending on the length of the stay abroad.

## Real costs application for participants with a degree of disability of 20 or more

Participants with an assessed GdB of 20 or more have the possibility to apply for a grant for the real additional costs of the mobility abroad up to 15,000 € per semester within the framework of a long-term application.
