As soon as you have received a **confirmation from the internship provider and have signed an internship contract, send it to the International Office together with a current certificate of enrolment and the completed and signed "Before the mobility" part of the Learning Agreement for Traineeships.** Afterwards we send you the necessary documents to apply for Erasmus+ funding.

Usually, Erasmus+ funding for traineeships abroad can only be applied for in programme countries. Below you will find an overview of the countries where we can fund you through Erasmus+.

If we still have budget available for funding mobility outside Europe in partner countries, we will inform you and make a decision between all applicants.



Eligible Programme Countries and associated funding rates

Group 1 Countries with higher living costs	Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Ireland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden. Third countries not associated to the Programme from Region 14.	750€ / month
Group 2 Countries with medium living costs	Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Malta, Netherlands, Portugal, Spain. Third countries not associated to the Programme from Region 13.	690€ / month
Group 3 Countries with lower living costs	Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, North Macedonia, Turkey.	640€ / month

The funding rates apply from the winter semester 2022/23. In the summer semester 2022, the funding rates of 2021 apply, which amount to 600€/540€/480€ in the 3 groups.

Possible increase (Top Ups) of monthly funding rates (programme countries):

From winter semester 2022/23 onwards, students who belong to one of the following groups will be included in the group of participants in "fewer opportunities"

Students who:

- are going abroad with child(ren),
- have a degree of disability of 20% or more,
- are chronically ill,
- are gainfully employed while studying in Germany,
- are a first-academic in their parents' home,

are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate:

for participants with "fewer opportunities": 250 € / month

for sustainable travelling: 50 € / month

In addition, we can grant you a one-time travel allowance of 50,00 € if you are travelling without a plane or not alone in a car (sustainable travel). Sustainable means of transport are: bus, train, carsharing. In addition, we will grant you up to four additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will send you.

From winter semester 2022/23 onwards, students who belong to one of the following groups will be included in the group of participants in the "fewer opportunities".

Students who:

- go abroad with child(ren),
- have a degree of disability of 20% or more,
- are chronically ill,
- are gainfully employed while studying in Germany,
- are a first-time student in their parents' home,

are entitled to a higher monthly funding rate:

for participants with "fewer opportunities": 250 € / month
for sustainable travelling: 50 € / month

Funding rates for blended short term mobilities (independent of the country)

If, during a course of your studies, you take part in a blended mobility, i.e., a course/ seminar/workshop organised jointly with a partner university and consisting of a virtual part and a possible short visit to the partner university, you have the possibility to receive financial support for the short stay abroad (between 5 and 30 days).

Duration of the physical activity	Amount (any Programme or Partner Country)
Up to the 14th day of activity	70 EUR per day
15th to the 30th day of activity	50 EUR per day



Possible increase in funding rates (blended mobilities):

We can grant you a one-time travel allowance of 50,00 € if you are travelling without a plane and not alone in a car (sustainable travel). Sustainable means of transport are: bus, train, carpool. In addition, we will grant you up to four additional travel days to the total funding period if you travel sustainably. For this, please keep the tickets or fuel receipts and fill out the "Declaration of Honour" that the International Office will send you.

One travel day before the activity and one travel day after the activity can be covered by the individual support (independent of sustainable travel).

From WiSe 2022/23 onwards, students who belong to one of the following groups will count as participants of the "fewer opportunities".

Students who:

- go abroad with child(ren),
- have a degree of disability of 20% or more
- are chronically ill,
- are gainfully employed while studying in Germany,
- are a first-time student in their parents' home,

receive a top-up amount to the individual support of their EU Erasmus+ grant of an amount of 100 EUR for a physical mobility activity period of 5-14 days and 150 EUR for the one of 15-30 days. The top-up amount for traineeships will not apply in this case. Additionally, these students receive travel allowances at short-term mobility.

Real costs application for participants with a degree of disability of 20 or more

Participants with an assessed GdB of 20 or more have the opportunity to apply for a grant for the real additional costs of mobility abroad up to 15,000 euros per semester within the framework of a long-term application.
