#### **AllMovie**

AllMovie offers information on filmmakers and films of all genres, since the beginning of cinematography at the end of the 19th century. In addition to biographies (over 27,000) and synopses (over 270,000), the database also provides comprehensive movie info including reviews, ratings, biographies and contains essays on various film genres and trends.

#### **EFARN Film Research Library**

The EFARN Film Research Library offers data and texts of the European film industry. A thematic search is offered as well as filter options by country, organization, language and year of release.

#### **Rotten Tomatoes**

Rotten Tomatoes is a free, ad-supported service that provides reviews, information and news about movies and computer games. According to the provider, the website, which was launched in 1998, is visited more than 7 million times a month and contains more than 250,000 film titles and 850,000 film reviews. In addition to online reviews by amateurs, professional reviews from the most important Anglo-American daily and weekly newspapers (including the "New York Times" and "Washington Post") are also evaluated and can be viewed in the respective film profiles under the "Top Critics" tab.
